"Thanks to Teacher Aid's support Nsobe Community School continues to grow and develop with our enrolment for 2023 at 650 students with 34 dedicated teachers plus support staff. Our results are top in our district, which is unheard of for a remote rural school. Developing and caring for the whole child, Nsobe School runs a daily feeding scheme, offers sports, clubs, computers, guidance, early years development, and vocational skills training. We have a Safe House for vulnerable girls to enable them to complete school in a nurturing environment and gain an educated control over their futures. We offer a Christ-Centered quality education, preparing pupils not only for jobs, but for life."

"Our heart is to educate, support and care for the vulnerable remote rural children in our surrounding villages. Our community relies on subsistence farming to support themselves and their families. No one in the villages has access to electricity, running water or ?ush toilets. Food is cooked outside over an open ?re, for which ?rewood has to be cut and hauled. Household and cooking water is carried distances from streams, hand dug wells or from the school's borehole.

We feed all our students every school day, and often this may be the only meal they get, and almost certainly the only protein. We are struggling to ?nd the funds to feed our students adequately as the school and its numbers have grown signi?cantly and the original feeding scheme support pledged was meant to feed 300 children twice a week and we now have 650 to feed daily. The food provided is a great motivating factor for the children to come to school.

We hope that this year's Gower Yomp can fundraise to help us support our school children's nutrition care."

Teacher Aid are changing lives and building a better future for vulnerable children through life-changing education in rural Zambia.

Remote rural families in Sub-Saharan Africa are unable to access and afford to send their children to school and traditional/cultural prejudices mean girls are encouraged into child marriages rather than attending school. For most children a quality education that we take for granted is not achievable, many children cannot even read or write on completing primary school, and so the cycle of poverty, hopelessness and unemployment continues.
